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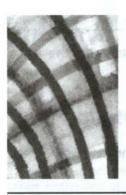

 Karsten T. Hansen, Kanishka Misra, Mallesh M. Pai
 We show that the long-run prices from independent machine learning algorithms depend on the informational value of price experiments. If low, the long-run prices are consistent with the static Nash equilibrium; however, if high, the long-run prices are supra-competitive.

 This paper provides the first empirical evidence on whether and why TV-moment-based search advertising could be effective for optimizing sponsored search advertising for both TV-advertised brands and their competitors.
- The Effect of Home-Sharing on House Prices and Rents: Evidence from Airbnb
 Kyle Barron, Edward Kung, Davide Proserpio
 We assess the impact of Airbnb on residential house prices and rents: using a data set of Airbnb listings from the entire United States and an instrumental variables estimation strategy, we show that Airbnb has a positive impact on house prices and rents.

 Using data from a field experiment, we find that mobile coupons lift revenue primarily by increasing visits to the website rather than through redemption.

 This paper develops a theory-based, cost-effective method to forecast actual product demand using inexpensive choice experiment data.

 This research investigates a multiproduct firm's decision of whether to use the same brand or different brands in different product markets, and in particular how this decision depends on the relatedness between the product markets.

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Metro rails mitigate pollution and congestion problems in crowded Indian cities and are therefore a priority of the Government. However, they are also very expensive to build and operate, making their operations loss-making.
